Scott MacInnes - Scott is most widely known for his trombone playing and teaching. He is a member of iTromboni, one of Canada's most entertaining and versatile chamber music ensembles. He has been the trombone instructor at the University of Victoria and the Principal Bass Trombonist with the Vancouver Island Symphony since 2006. When Scott puts the trombone down, he can be found directing the BC Brass Collective as well as the UVic Vikes Band. He is tremendously honoured to be able to work with the fantastic musicians that constitute the Meridien Wind Orchestra.

-Guest Conductors-

Dr. Steven Capaldo is currently an Associate Professor of Music Education & Conducting, the Wind Symphony Conductor and Co-Head of Music Education at the University of Victoria. Steven has extensive conducting experience working with symphony orchestras, wind orchestras and chamber ensembles. As an active writer, Steven composes, arranges and transcribes music for wind orchestras, symphony orchestras, festivals and concerts and his works have been performed by groups in Australia, Canada, Japan and the United States, recorded on Klavier records (US) and published with Brolga Music and Murphy Music Press. An Assistant Producer and Co-Editor for eight Klavier Records CDs, Steven became a full voting member for the US Grammy Awards in 2010 and was Chair of the Australian Jury Panel for the 2017 International Eurovision Song Contest. Distinguishing himself as one of the most respected music educators, wind conductors and conductor educators in Australia, Steven has earned academic and musical recognition locally, nationally and internationally. He is in demand as a conductor, clinician and adjudicator, and is committed to providing professional learning opportunities for music educators and conductors.

Ben Litzcke graduated from the University of Victoria in 2013 with a Bachelor of Music and is now back at UVic working on a Master of Music in Wind Conducting with Dr. Steven Capaldo. He has played clarinet with Meridien for a few years and is excited to be conducting this group for the first time!

-Guest Soloist-

Nicholas Atkinson, Tuba player Nicholas Atkinson has enjoyed a professional career of over fifty-five years. He began as a bandsman in the Canadian Army. After completing a Bachelor of Music in Performance at the University of Calgary he studied privately with the legendary Arnold Jacobs in Chicago. He later completed the degree of Master of Arts in English at the University of Ottawa. He was Principal Tuba with the National Arts Centre Orchestra from 1976-2017, appearing several times as a featured soloist, and has performed with all of the major Canadian orchestras. In 1989 he filled the position of Principal Tuba with Orchestre Symphonique de Montréal. He was a member of the Rideau Lakes Brass Quintet, Ragtime Brass and Capital BrassWorks and performed extensively with the Hannaford Street Silver Band. He was also a founding member of the Canadian National Brass Project. Mr. Atkinson is a well-known brass teacher and coach. He taught at the University of Ottawa from 1976-2003, at Queens University from 1983-93, and has given masterclasses at all of the major Canadian music schools. From 2006-2017 he was low-brass coach with the National Youth Orchestra of Canada. He has been a clinician for both Boosey and Hawkes and Yamaha. Since his retirement to Victoria in 2017 he has remained active as a player and brass coach.
